## 1. Student visa:

I applied for the student Visa in June and got it approved in two weeks. Beforehand, I checked what type of documents were needed. However, I would say that the number of papers needed was quite important so I would advise the next exchange students to really be careful when applying for the visa by checking the information they write and the documents they have.

# 2. Flight ticket information:

I bought my ticket for Korea in June for arriving the 25<sup>th</sup> of August in Korea. I bought my ticket to fly back in France in September and not in June too since I wanted to wait to see how long I will stay in Korea after the end of the semester since my visa is available until January. Thus, my return flight is on the 20<sup>th</sup> of December so I'll be able to enjoy time with my friends in Korea after the finals.

# 3. Money exchange:

I did not exchange any money in France because the rate was very high. I exchanged a few euros at Incheon airport just in case the taxi did not take any foreign card. For the rest of the euros I brought with me, I exchanged them in Myeongdong since the rate was the best. I still have some euros left to exchange and I'll change them later in the semester.

I would recommend not to rely only on money exchange and get an international option on your card to get few to no fees when withdrawing cash in Korea. That's what I mostly do because cash is actually needed in Korea since sometimes foreign card do not work or you need to repay

your friends in cash.

I applied with the group registration for ARC. I thought that it was easier and everything was very clear and structured. I just followed the instructions and it was pretty quick. It might be a little stressful to apply for the group registration because you only have two days to do it but it worth it. For now, I don't have my ARC yet

#### 4. Exams:

The mid-term period was pretty stressful but the outcome was better than expected. If you study, you'll get good results. I'd say that there are many places to study in the campus so you can easily change your studying environment to feel better. Exams are mostly mcq which I wasn't used to (in France it's mostly essays or open questions) so if you're not used to it, try to prepare yourself for it.

# 5. Course list that you took in this semester:

I took 5 classes: Business English, Operation Management, Financial Management, Consumer Behavior and Ethical Management & Cases.

Most classes have different types of evaluation, it's not just the midterm and the final exam. I appreciate this system because it less of a burden for students because you can improve your

grades with assignments, attendance and group projects.

I really recommend the Business English class with Michael Keith Cook since this class is really useful because you learn how to interact and work in the business world. ## TRANSPORTATION

## 1. Type of transportation:

In Korea, I mostly use public transportations. The network of transportation is very important so you'll always find a way to go to your destination. However, the public transportation network closes very early: at midnight most of the lines are closed. Thus, you'll need to take a taxi. Nevertheless, taxis in Korea are very cheap (compared to Europe at least) and it's very easy to order one with apps like Kakao Taxi.

#### 2. Fees:

In Korea, there isn't any weekly/monthly/yearly subscription for the public transportation. You are charged every time you take a public transportation. Nevertheless, it is pretty cheap but if you use it on daily basis and for a long distance it can be quick costly. Thus, if you want to find an accommodation by yourself, take this into consideration.

#### 3. T-money card:

I bought a T-money card on my first day in Korea at the closest convenient store from my accommodation. I would advise to get one as soon as possible because you need it to use public transportation and you can pay with it in convenient stores too. One thing about it is that you need to charge it with cash and not card.

## 4. Some tips for saving money:

For saving money, try to walk as much as possible. Sometimes, the itinerary will show that after taking the subway, you need to take a bus. However, it can be for a few hundred meters. Try to check if you can reach your destination by feet without using all the public transportation showed on your map.
